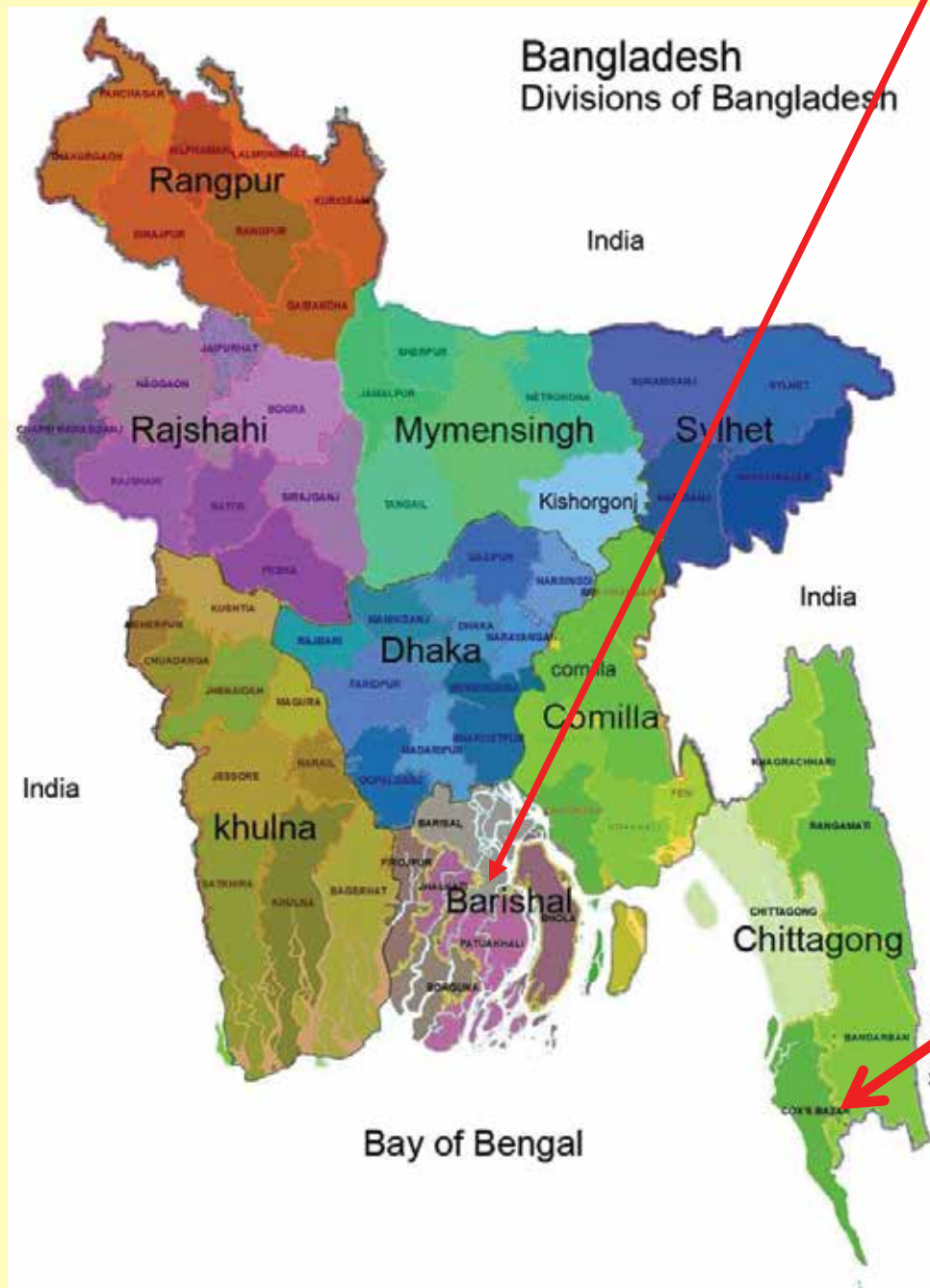

Introduction

The Aloshikha RSD Center is a window of opportunity for vulnerable people access to knowledge, skills, and information they need to improve their lives and livelihood. Aloshikha RSD Centre Bangladesh is a professionally managed not-for-profit social development organization, registered with the Ministry of Social Welfare, NGO Affairs Bureau, and micro-credit regulatory authority and also affiliated by the Ministry of Health and Family Planning of Bangladesh.

The working area of Aloshikha RSD Center is located in the southern coastal region of Bangladesh, where river the Padma (called Ganges in India) and the Jamuna (called Brahmaputra in India) merge into the Meghna river. Floods are an annual phenomenon of the region, which impacts life and livelihood of poor people of the location. Aloshikha has already grown into a well-known local organization that tries to support the poorest of the poor of society both in the form of social and economic aspect. Gopalganj, Barishal and Madaripur district are its working area. In order to reach support to outreach locations Aloshikha has established branch offices in four locations. In addition Aloshikha has established small community centers (PRIMA) where there is a class room for a pre-school and small office space for health education activities.

Aloshikha is committed to addressing various social and economic problems of the economically downtrodden and vulnerable groups in general. Empowerment of communities is a central focus of all Aloshikha development initiatives. Over the years, the organization has extended its geographical coverage, beneficiary and programmatic coverage quite significantly. The long term development program now includes non-formal and vocational education, poultry, fishery, health, water and sanitation. All these works are aimed at providing support to disadvantaged poor people. Over the years we have to face many difficulties and challenges such as political unrest, natural disaster, and financial constraints as well.

ALOSHIKHA works exclusively in rural areas, primarily to support local people help access to water and sanitation, pre-primary education, vocational training/education, hospital and health promotion. Other programs include environment and forestry, fisheries, agriculture and providing capital support to its beneficiaries for their income generation.

Aloshikha believes in potentialities of its target people that's why focuses were given to an intergraded comprehensive program uniting the poor into groups and emphasizes social, education and economic elements since 1985.

Since then, Aloshikha successes have included community based health and sanitation programs in remote villages, raising awareness of women rights and women empowerment, and promoting savings, and skill development training to improve the livelihoods of the poor section of the community. Aloshikha's program continues to evolve and innovating current realities mean the program now comprises a range of various projects and financing, large and small, which all contribute to achieve a common objective. We are encouraging local communities to receiving all forms of education, vocational or otherwise, to strengthen their self-employment opportunities or make them more employable.

Empowering the rural poor, however, is a prerequisite for sustainable development and enjoying of their rights. It requires overcoming challenges of exclusion, discrimination and exploitation of the landless, women, indigenous people and other dispossessed people. Aloshikha is committed to its works and trying its best to support the poorest of the poor and vulnerable population.

In recent years, several development projects have been initiated to address issues such as coastal zone management, enhancing livelihoods of the coastal population and empowering, economically, vulnerable rural poor women groups by transferring wealth and assets for alternative income generation and self-employment. This report is a testimony to the fact that with a synergetic approach towards development, support from the donor, community, and the local people, can do a lot to improve livelihoods of poor. Thanks to all the donors who supported generously to help implement the programs/projects.

Mission statement of Aloshikha:

Aloshikha is a Bangladeshi non-profitable humanitarian non-government organization supporting the holistic development of poor and landless people in the rural marshlands between Gopalganj, Madaripur and Barisal.

Aloshikha supports the following development areas:

- **Education** (elementary and vocational)
- **Health and nutrition** (clinical & PHP), capacity building of traditional birth attendant, family planning.
- **Water, Sanitation and Hygiene** (WASH), awareness raising on safe water and sanitation, deep tube wells (DTW) for safe drinking water, and sanitary latrine distribution.
- **Social protection** (women empowerment, adolescent girls, SGBV activities and referral system Development)
- **Income generation activities** (IGA) (poultry, fishing, dairy and milk production etc)
- **Solar Panel System** as green energy sources
- **Tribal empowerment** through education and IGA

Aloshikha support specifics local development with the following activities:

- **Awareness raising** on the importance of education, health, safe water & sanitation, women development issues and community problems.
- **Organizing targeted poor people in small groups** and make them skilled through education, trainings, workshops and meetings etc.
- **Encouraging and motivating poor people** to take steps to reduce their problems; improve their health conditions and their income so that they will become self- reliant.
- **Strengthening child development** through child health education, nutritious food distribution, creativity materials etc.
- **Providing safe water supply** for hygienic health through the DTWs and sanitary latrine distribution, Encouraging communities to use **solar power** as an alternative and renewable energy source
- **Providing skills training** and creating employment opportunities among locally unemployed youth, through the Vocational Training Center, for job creation locally and for international labor markets
- **Providing the food, nutrition, and education of orphaned boys and girls**
- **Supporting the needs of disabled people**

Highlighted Focus Areas:

Women Empowerment

The situation of women in Bangladesh is still deplorable, has low social status and economic dependency. Equal rights, freedom of speech, no violence, free choice and full participation in all societal activities should be desirable. Aloshikha actively promotes women and women's issues in all programs and projects. Areas of concern for poor rural women include legal rights, gender equality, domestic violence, sexual harassment, eve teasing, rape, reproductive health provision, trafficking to women and girls', early marriages and dowry etc.. Awareness raising, advocacy campaigns and practical project activities are carried out with involvement of a variety of stakeholders to eliminate those inequalities.

Promotion of Safe Migration and Rights:

The program particularly focuses on promotion of safe migration and rights to Bangladeshi migrant workers; pre-departure, post-arrival and integration assistance for migrants from the Middle East countries. These supports include establishing of pre-departure services and assistance in destination countries and reintegration upon return of Bangladeshi migrant workers to their families. Awareness rising on safe migration and prevention of undocumented migration from Bangladesh, in general are the activities. The main objective of this program is to promoting congenial environment for migrant workers and their families at all stages of migration with regards to respect for their rights and dignity.

Special events in 2024



The additional Director (AD) of Social Welfare Office Barishal visited to the Alosikhia Middle Rajihar Orphanage home on 24-1-2024. During his visit he sat with Orphanage Executive Board and enquires about the present management system of the orphanage and gave some suggestions to develop the management of the orphanage. He also sat with 35 children, out of which 21 boys and 14 girls, who receive capitation grant from Ministry of Social Welfare. He expressed his satisfaction over the performance of the children and good shape of the orphanage.



Simon Crewe, Director, Dent Aid and her wife Lize visited the Alosikhia Dental Department on 17-2-2024. He along with doctors from Alosikhia also gave dental services towards the students and local children of Alosikhia organizing a campaign. After successful conclusion of the camp he expresses his desire to launch a 3 years programme to improve dental health of children of the locality.



Maarten Verbruggen, Ms. Safia, Ms. Emra, Mr. Atikur visited Aloshikha community library on 3/5/2024 and inaugurated the community library. After inauguration the visitors expressed their desire to operate the community library under Aloshikha Vocation Training Center (VTC). The Community library should have 5000 books of different writers that include fiction, non-fiction and development. Apart from that the community library should have modern equipments and amenities that include, Wi-Fi connection, internet, computer etc.. However, due to fund constraining the construction work is hanging.



After visiting the Aloshikha on 24/02/2024 a review was done by Md. Anower Pervaje, Field Manager of BSRM, whether Aloshikha Hospital needs a digital X-ray Machine or not. The option was to replace the existing analog X-Ray machine with a digital one. However, seeing feasibility of required digital X-Ray machine, and a digital X-ray machine was set up with the funding of BSRM on June 28, 2024. The X-ray machine is in operation right now. Ms. Sabeen Aameir, Managing Director, BSRM, and Mr. Sawmitra, Head of CSR, BSRM, Chittagong approved funding for purchasing the digital X-Ray machine and with the nice communication officer Mr. Ariful Islam (BSRM) We are grateful for their contribution,



Ms. Joke Bos, Education specialist, paid visit to Alosikhya VTC on 20-10-24. She conducted a 7 day long training program for the VTC teachers; in different occasions students also attended the training session. She taught the teachers how to impart lessons effectively and fruitfully following the present govt. VTC curriculum. She helped us to devise an action plan and we are following the action plan.



Maarten Verbruggen, Deltadesh, along with his 6- members family visited Alosikhya on December 26, 2024. They visited and inspected all the activities of Alosikhya. They expressed their satisfaction over the performance of the activities and hoped to continue their generous support for Alosikhya.



NSDA Visit 15-4-24

Mr. Humayun Kabir, Director of NSDA visited to the VTC of Aloshekha on 27-05-24. He expressed his satisfaction over the academic activities of VTC. He expressed his intention to keep continuing the support for betterment of the VTC. However, being satisfied, he approved new 6 trades such as welding, mechanical, electrical, IT, care giving, fashion design, for the VTC.



Dr. Tom Geers, expert in internal medicine, from PUM, The Netherlands, came to the Aloshekha hospital on April 04, 2024 and stayed for 2 weeks. During his stay, he sat with the doctors and nurses of the Maria Mother General Hospital of Aloshekha and found out some problems and guided them how overcome the problems to render better services.

He also orientated the doctors, & nurses and representatives of different medicine company,

organizing a orientation program how to render better treatment in terms of diagnostic and treatment to the patient collaboratively.

He also found out persisting problems of the hospital especially out dated or analogue machine & equipments of the hospital. He expressed his intention to modernize the hospital with digital machines and equipments. He also expressed his intention to mobilize fund for the purpose. He devised a 1 year long action plan how to upgrade the hospital step by step in terms of infrastructure and treatment. He also sat with the management of the hospital and made them know about the problem of the hospital and his plan to upgrade the services of the hospital. However, modernization of the hospital will help better services; at the same time turn out of the patients will also be increased.

During his visit he also rendered treatment services to the local people and guided the doctors and nurses of the hospital how to handle the patients effectively and improve the services.



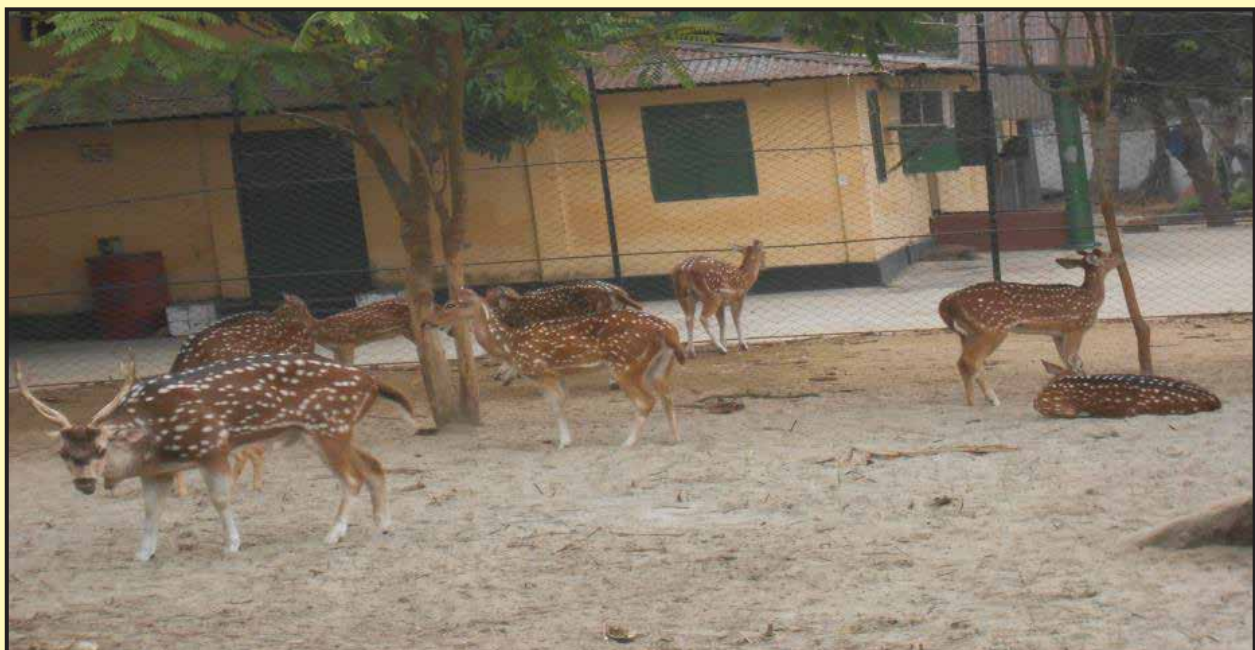
Mr. Sawrop Bhattacharya, Managing Director, Sister Margaret Foundation, India arrived in Rajihar at the Aloshikha Head office on 27 March 2024. He visited all the activities of the organization and stayed for about 1 month at Aloshikha. During his stay, he visited all the activities of Aloshikha at its working villages. During his integrated visit he came to know about the activities of Aloshikha and felt need to support its activities for the betterment of its target people. After his visit Sister Margaret Foundation, India signed a MOU with Aloshikha to give technical support at VTC and also mobilization of fund from renowned company of India for enhancing services of Aloshikha.



After completion of construction work of ground floor of the propped 4- storied VTC building, the Executive Engineer, Barishal handed over the key of the floor to the Executive Director of Aloshikha on April 24, 2024. He gave suggestions about the maintenance of the floor for making the environment congenial for imparting VTC education. He also expressed his desire to complete the construction work of the building as soon as possible.

Deer Conservation Program

Mr. Tanmoy Archarjo, Inspector and Research Officer of Department of Wildlife Animal Conservation, Bangladesh visited Aloshikha on October 21, 2024, particularly to oversee the Deer Conservation Program. After close scrutiny and necessary desk works, he issued a Firm Category license to Aloshikha. Initially an individual license was given, during startup of the program when scope of rearing up was only 10 deer according to the rules of the license. Currently the Firm has 12 deer having heavy protection of wire-net boundary and has an excellent proper scientific management, treatment and care in place. However, being deer rearing is a complex matter in terms of govt. compliances and wild life conservation rules and regulations we have decided to close the farm from 2024.



Pre-school program

From year 1985 to 2022, Aloshikha had been running 41 pre-schools in different parts of the Barishal, Gopalganj and Madaripur district. At present there are 30 pre-schools in place from 2023 to ongoing. 11 schools have been phased out because the implication of the pre-school have been come to an lower extent.

According to provision of the project, every pre-school has 30 children each. Now 900 children are being enrolled at present at these 30 schools. After completion of one year pre-school schooling, the children are facilitated to get admission into government primary schools in class one. The children are imparted elementary education with different extra-curricular activities. The children are taught in a joyful environment. The extracurricular activities include singing, dancing, annual sports, educational tour, etc. In terms of nutrition children are given nutritional food once a month. Besides mother are also taught how to prepare nutritional food at home.

Besides monthly parents meetings are also conducted in each school where mothers attend the meeting. The parents meeting discuss about the performance of the children and other child rights and different issues of the society such as Child abuse, early marriage, dowry, child labor, trafficking and related issues. However, the children also get free medical checkup and quality sanitation & hygiene messages.

Mary Orphan Home (Middle Rajihar)

Mary Orphanage Home started its journey in 2014 with only 10 helpless orphan children and later it has included another 30 children and it means now 40 children are living in this Home. Some of the children do not have their mother or either father or some cases they have lost their parents. Alosikhya RSD Center has taken this specialized initiative to ensure their rehabilitation including education, health and create employment opportunity in future. Currently all the children are studying in the Maria Child Care and VTC School which are operated and guided by the Alosikhya RSD Center. The chief initiator of the Orphanage Home, Mrs. Martha Halder thinks that it would be praiseworthy to establish them in the main stream of our society through these services. At present 35 children of which 21 boys and 14 girls are residing at the orphanage home. Many children are coming every day from different parts of the country to this orphanage home but it is not possible to accommodate them due to financial constraint and lack of other supports. Merely as a private sector initiative it would not be possible to meeting up the huge expense of their fundamental rights that we have undertaken from 2014-2024. In this context we are cordially seeking helping hands from kind hearted people from regional, national or international levels who intends to support the initiative.

Education program (Kindergarten school):

We felt that education is important for all and without education none can take part in the nation building process. As we know, the Kindergarten education system is costly compared to government primary education. The Alosikhha initially started one kindergarten school on its campus which eventually established three kindergarten schools in different places. The main focus of the program is to ensure quality education and explore creativity for their cognitive development. Parents meeting are held on school premises yearly 2 times with a view to assess how they achieved quality education. In Bangladesh most Kindergarten schools are mainly academic oriented, but at Alosikhha we put emphasis on extracurricular activities among the students like painting, drawing, cultural programs on occasion of Independence Day, victory day, and Bangla New Year observation etc. In addition, we raise a voice against child abuse and child trafficking and their rights, road safety and to promoting their wellbeing.

VTC Program

The Alosikhha RSD Center is operating one vocational training center at its campus. The main focus of the program is to create job placement among the rural unemployed youth, for both girls and boys. At present five trade courses are in operating; Mechanical, Electrical, Tailoring & Dress Making, welding and fabrication, and IT trade. According to the requirement and curriculum of the technical Board, every trade course has 30 students each, for both the girls and boys. The center has been able to convince the local unemployed youth that vocational education is a resource for income generating process and job facilities at national and international labor markets.

The Alosikhha Vocational Training Center is duly affiliated by the Bangladesh Technical Education Board. The Center has recently affiliated as SSC Vocational Course. The Board has the responsibility to support the center with logistic and other amenities. In the year of 2024, 85 students appeared at SSC examination (Vocational). Out of the 85 students 79 students passed out.



Ministry of Education of Bangladesh has approved a 5 storied building for our vocational training centre. In the mean time construction of the ground floor has been completed and all furniture and fixture have been procured for conducting classes. After completion of the construction work of the first floor, the Executive Engineer, Facilities Department, Barishal, has handed over the key of the floor to the Executive Director of Alosikhha.

In future we are going to conduct pre-vocational courses in this academic building. However, Bangladesh govt. has affiliated 654 pre-vocational (grade 6- grade 8) institution on 02.02.2025 Alosikhha has also got the affiliation ; Reg No - 405. At presents VTC of Alosikhha (EIIN - 138052,) conducting education from grade six to grade ten.

Fishing program



Fish play an important role in the Bangladeshi diet constituting the main and often irreplaceable animal protein source in poor rural households. In this point of view Aloshikha has undertaken a fish cultivation program in its own water bodies with both the high yielding varieties and local indigenous species of fish.

Rice and fish dominate the diet of Bangladeshis to such an extent that the old common proverb “Machee Bhatee Bengali” which can be translated as “Fish and rice make a Bengali perfect” continues to hold true. Fish is an essential and irreplaceable food in the rural Bangladeshi diet. Together with rice, this is eaten at least twice per day with small amount of vegetables and fish make up the typical meal.

Bangladesh is dominated by floodplains and rivers, which are rich ecosystems for fresh water fish. The floodplains which comprise over half of the country, are inundated annually during the monsoon which facilitate agriculture and natural fisheries as well. In the monsoon to post monsoon season (June to November) the floodplains provide an ideal habitat for the wide varieties of wild fish species, whereas in the dry season, the land is cultivated with rice. However, the importance of fish as a rich source of animal protein is well established and this is frequently used to justify fish as a valuable food, whereas very little attention has been given to the role of fish in supplying vitamin A and minerals in the diet. Aloshikha has four big ponds, where it cultivates fish both for the purpose of internal dietary supply and generating revenue for the organization.



Poultry and Dairy Program:

Poultry

Since 23 years Aloshikha has been inspiring community people to adopt poultry farm businesses. It was a much neglected business to the community people due to problems such as bad smell from poultry feces, soft meat and high morbidity and mortality of the birds. However, Aloshikha's programs have achieved great success in developing and training communities in profitable poultry business models. Today many small poultry farms are being established in surrounding areas using the model of Aloshikha poultry farm. People now recognize Aloshikha as a pioneer of the poultry business. Presently it seems to be a profit making program; rearing high yielding layer breed that are used for both meat and eggs purpose.



Dairy Farm

Aloshikha started its cow rearing program through Dairy Farm concept in 2000 and currently it has 10 cows in the farm. The dairy farm ensures milk and sustainable supply to the local community at lower cost. Unfortunately the program had not been profit making due to some adverse environment such lack of food and inadequate grazing land, low-lying flood prone area and have not abundantly high land where cows can graze freely. For this reason the program will be develop slowly.

Goat Rearing Program:

This program started with three goats in 2019 by Martha Halder, the monitor of Aloshika. At present, the number of goats raised to 30, local black bengal variety. Hopefully, this project would bring a great profit for her. The program is really beneficial to the beneficiaries. Demands drive Aloshika to spend it as soon as possible. The program will be integrated to Aloshika's IGA program. No fund is available right now for the program but the fund raising efforts are in progress.

Maria Mother General Hospital

This hospital grant was awarded from the Japanese Government in late 1997 for infrastructure development and purchase of materials but did not have financial support for administrative costs. Still we are operating our activities for over 26 years and using all medical accessories properly.

In 1996 in order to reduce the gaps between health services and the community, and to raise awareness amongst the poor of available health program the Maria Mother & Child Health Care Clinic was established and later it became a general hospital with strong referral system in the community of remote village under Barisal district in Bangladesh.

The program staff of this general hospital has been able to identify and treat the ailments in surrounding communities. It also met with the Upazila health and family planning offices to identify the best approaches to meet the needs of vulnerable populations.

Under this project at least 08 female Health Motivators are working in the field levels and they are always active to identify primary health problems and record them in referral slips. Patients then take these slips to nearby Maria general hospital and are given preferential treatment. For health practitioners, the use of the slips means doctors can quickly identify the issues of concern and more importantly see cases in need of treatment. However the main focus of the program is to provide low cost medical service delivery amongst poor section of people, especially who are not able to access health services due to their acute poverty and adverse surroundings in the intervention areas. In that case the health motivators take the responsibility to identify gaps between the clients and provide them counseling about

Ailments that are what they should do during pregnancy if any complications arise. They also advise how they access postnatal and antenatal care and all sorts of primary health care services amongst poor community.

The above circumstances were the main reasons for Alosikhha to start a small hospital with medical equipments and especial attention is given to the health condition of women and children. Finally the hospital is registered with the Ministry of Health Bangladesh Government and recognized as 10 beds general hospital. This hospital started its services in January 1997 but is still in the process of becoming financially self-sustaining. Alosikhha hopes to reach self-sustainability in the shortest time possible.

However, Tom Geer, came to Rajshihar in 2024 and stayed for 2 weeks at stretch and oriented the doctors, nurses how to improve the services of the hospital. Founding out some problems of the hospital he, devised a 10 year action plan for upgrading the infrastructure and services of the hospital. He also sat with management of the hospital

and made them know about the problem of the hospital and his plan to upgrade the services of the hospital. However, modernization of the hospital will help better services; at the same time turn out of the patients will also be increased.

During his visit he also rendered treatment services to the local people and guided the doctors and nurses of the hospital how to handle the patients effectively and improve the services.

Maria Mother & Child Health Care Clinic services through the trained health providers are as follows:

- a. Indoor/Outdoor 24 hours medical emergency service
- b. Major/minor operation facilities
- c. Ante-natal, neo-natal and post-natal along incubation facilities
- d. Diagnostics facilities such as Ultrasound, Diathermia, incubator, ECG, Digital X-ray, Blood, urine, stool, sputum etc.
- e. Resistance fund facility for the poor
- f. Patients referral (Ambulance) and out call facilities
- g. Family planning, safe motherhood, breastfeeding, HIV and hygiene counseling
- h. Audio/ Video health conciseness program for out/indoor patients
- i. Collaboration with the Bangladesh government such as EPT, NID, sterilization etc.

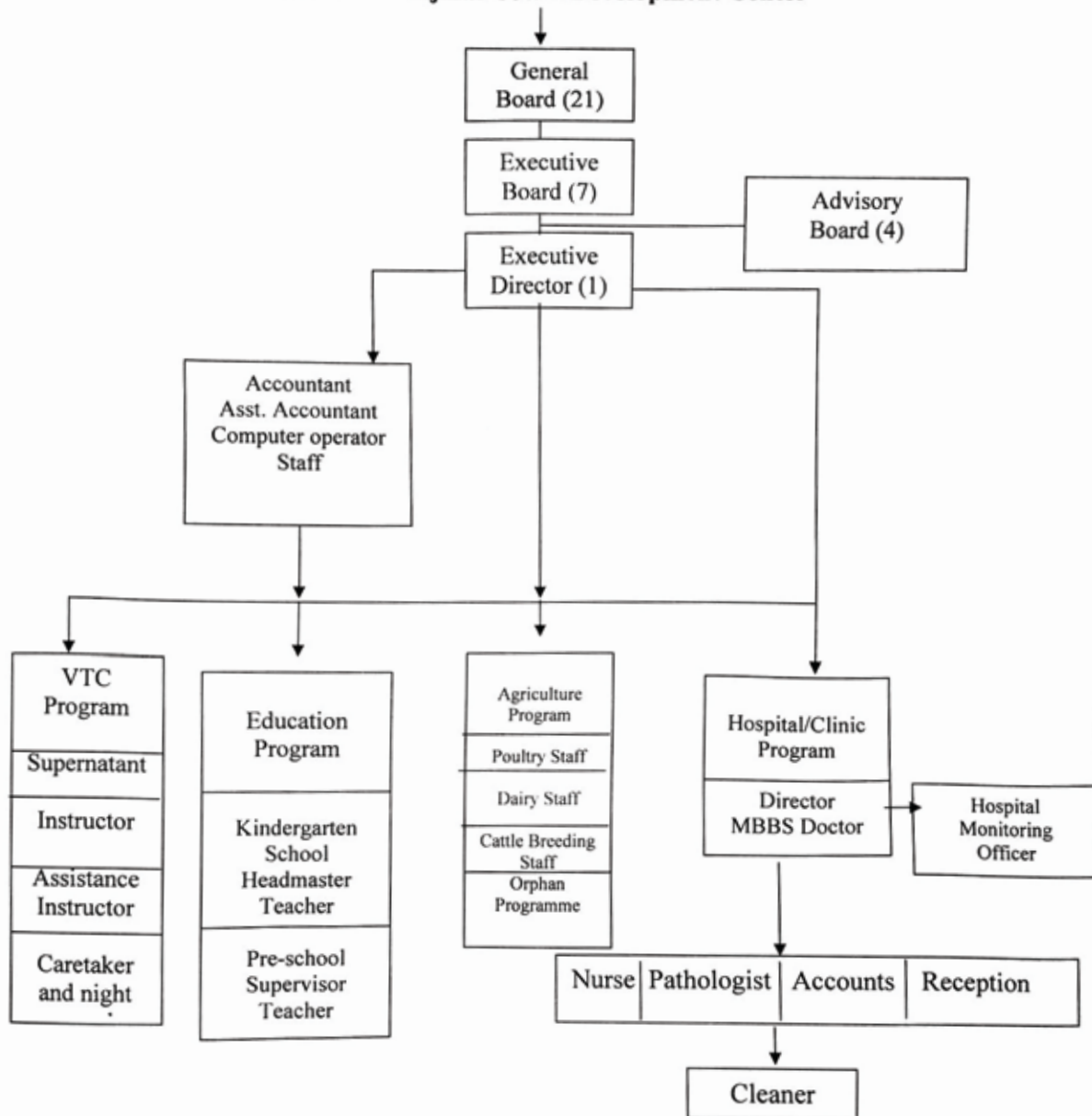
